We were able to help our Post/Aux members with meals after illnesses. Our Aux also works hand & hand with the Post at their monthly fundraising Breakfast. Aux members put together baskets to raffle off at the breakfast to raise money for our relief fund. We also sent out 71 troop care boxes at Christmas and \$3,762 in coupons were sent to our adopted base in Japan.
